For Release the week of Sept 3, 2017:

The sport of radio controlled flying combines model building and flying skills. The Indianapolis South Radio-Control club is one of the oldest clubs in the city, and has been at its present location in northern Johnson County for over 40 years.

The Club is hosting its 32st annual benefit air show "Fly-In for Diabetes" on Saturday, **September the 16th**, at their flying field just south of Greenwood Indiana. The public is invited to visit Rike field to see a great Radio-Control model air show and help raise money that will go directly to the American Diabetes Association.

The day's events feature something for the entire family. On display and in the air throughout the day will be a variety of high-performance and scale radio controlled models. Continuous flying demonstrations during the event will include aircraft ranging from 1/3 scale WWI biplanes to WWII fighters, to dazzling aerobatic helicopters and hovering ¼ scale modern-day aerobatic scale models. There may even be a few drones flown by "responsible pilots". Children will have the opportunity to participate in periodic candy-drops from a radio-controlled Piper Cub.

The air show begins at 12AM and continues until 5 PM. There is no admission charge. Visitors are encouraged to bring lawn chairs/blankets. Refreshments prepared and served by club members will be available at an attractive price.

To find our field enter: 3200 E. Worthsville Rd. in your GPS, or just take I 65 to exit 97 (Worthsville road) and travel east approx. one mile on Worthsville/750N. Signs will be posted to help guide visitors to the field via a gate on the north side of the road.
